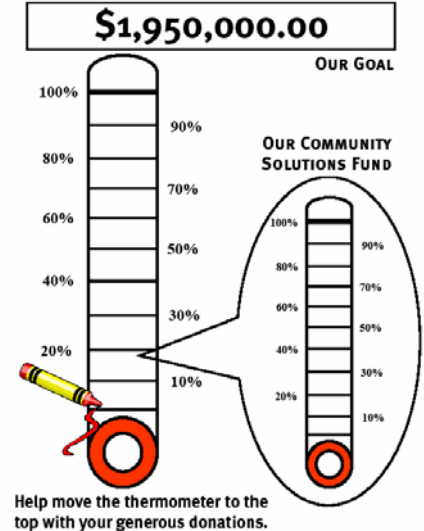


# Community Solutions Fund Covers Grants, Allocations
